As we reflect on the past year, we are proud to share how Mothercraft continues to grow with vision while staying deeply rooted in our purpose. For nearly a century, our work has been guided by a commitment to supporting healthy child development, strengthening families, and building stronger communities. That commitment remains the foundation of everything we do.

Guided by our long-term strategic plan, Vision 2031, this past year has been one of meaningful growth across all areas of the organization. We have expanded training and professional development opportunities, deepened our community partnerships, and adapted our services to meet the evolving needs of children, families, and professionals. This growth is not just about scale; it is about deepening impact and preserving our commitments to quality. And we can't achieve any of these goals without the remarkable leadership and dedication of our staff, who continue to show up every day with compassion, creativity, and care.

We were proud to achieve full enrolment across all of our Centres for Early Development for the first time since 2020. This milestone reflects not only recovery but renewed trust and

confidence from families. We also welcomed back beloved community events, including the resumption of the Magic Castle holiday party, a joyful gathering for children and families who are receiving treatment at Princess Margaret Hospital; an event we haven't been able to hold since before the pandemic.

Our work is continually enriched by partnerships. In 2024, we established new collaborations with the Native Canadian Centre of Toronto, Strong Minds Strong Kids Psychology Canada, and Toronto Public Health, all of which supported us in delivering inclusive and culturally responsive programs.

Mothercraft staff also shared their expertise on national and international stages, presenting at the Canadian Psychological Association's Annual Convention and the World Forum on Early Care and Education, reinforcing our leadership in early childhood development, research, and policy.

At the same time, we are putting our equity commitments into practice with intention. From engaging an Indigenous Knowledge Keeper to share land-based teachings to implementing self-regulation training across leadership teams, we are working to turn our values into meaningful, measurable action.



2024 Highlights



Edmond and Jeanne Mertzenich first accessed Mothercraft services in 1959, soon after arriving in Canada from Belgium. As new immigrants who did not speak English and had no support network in Toronto, they faced challenges when Jeanne experienced postpartum complications and Edmond needed to return to work. Mothercraft provided care for their newborn son while Jeanne recovered.

Jeanne passed away in 2020, but the couple never forgot the role Mothercraft played during this pivotal time in their lives. More than sixty years later, Edmond chose to honour this experience by making a **donation to Mothercraft's Magic Castle program** in 2024. We are deeply grateful for the generosity




